A few thoughts on handling Christmas. The word on my mind this morning is the word "STAY".

### 1. Stay focused on the Facts of Christmas

#### 4. Stay Focused on Family this Christmas

In the recent US elections, people were told not to fellowship with their families who voted differently than them. Maybe we should make families a priority this Christmas. Have a meal together and express our love for each other.

# 5. Stay focused on the Fields at Christmas

If ever there was a time during the year when it is easier to share the gospel, it is during the Christmas season. Yesterday, I realized I had not shared Christ with anyone for a few days.

Theresa and I went to Kings Landing for a Christmas visit. This place is a historic recreation of a 19<sup>th</sup> century village where you get to see 70 historic buildings including homes, farms, a mill, a school, and two churches. Before the day was over at Kings Landing, I had chances to share Christ.

Inside the door at Kings Landing is a thank you sign for the many ways people have ministered to this organization. I jotted them down.
