Youth Ministries

Our team has been continuing to go to various churches and Christian schools in the area to run Bible clubs. We have labored to make the gospel known to these students for a few years now and are always encouraged when they become confident in their faith and grow passionate about reaching their friends with the gospel. We have also been investing in other churches in the area to offer help and training in various ways. We desire to see youth leaders properly equipped to train their students in the Word and to ultimately make disciples who, in turn, make more disciples here in Pyeongtaek and throughout all Korea.



Trip to the Philippines

I had the privilege a few weeks back to go to the Philippines to take part in some evangelism training and observe a camp at Word of Life Philippines. The focus of the training and the camp is to better equip and spur their youth to take part in evangelism and disciple-making. We started with a day of praying for our lost friends, family, and community. The next day, we went into the poorer communities to bring rice and other grocery items to people in need. Alongside the students, we took time to listen to these people, share the gospel, and pray with them. On the last day, we went to local parks to have gospel conversations with various people. Students are hearing youth leaders preach the gospel, and in turn, they step out in faith and begin conversations with others. This is something we hope to incorporate more into our camps here in Korea.

believed? And how are they to believe in him of whom they have never heard? And how are they to hear without someone preaching? And how are they to preach unless they are sent? As it is written, “How beautiful are the feet of those who preach the good news!”

She has been presenting her favourite book, *The Little Pilgrim's Big Journey*, chapter by chapter. The other day, I took Lucy out to help her learn to ride her bike without training wheels. I was gripping her seat like usual, and then I let go—and away she went! I told her I wasn't hanging on anymore, and all she could do was grin.

Joshua has been growing like a bad weed. I can no longer hold him long without my arm getting sore. He has been having some skin trouble, so please pray for him. Joshua always gets passionate about singing the Scripture memory song each morning with the few words he can put together. He is speaking a lot more these days. His Korean is better than his English, but both languages are continually improving.
